In Harper Lee's magnum opus, "To Kill a Mockingbird", Atticus Finch warns "You may shoot all the bluejays if you can get 'em, but remember it's a sin to kill a mockingbird". The ceiling here was society's incredulity at damning a black man and the floor was racial equality.

Religious scriptures in all languages bemoan the lack of virtues in humanity as they enunciate what may qualify, so that mankind may seek deliverance. One that can only be accompanied by raising the floor of tolerance and the ceiling of excellence

Through the expositions in this article, it is my intent to establish why humanity's very survival hinges on expanding the two extremes, while also surveying where such bounds may serve as protective confines.

Not a Zero Sum Game

Human capabilities have expanded to allow such upgradations of the skeletal structures of any grand edifice, permitting elevation and demolition as the wielder of the pen may seem fit. This ability to reshape canvasses is what may be relied on to change the dimensions of our existence

Poverty, since time immemorial has been mankind's greatest affliction. At any period of time, those that dwell in extreme poverty have always been the largest share of the population. Through devices of societal make, it is now conceivable to uplift large sections from this malignant malady.

If the floor of what means to be poor is elevated, the roof can be shifted up as

well. The rich may get richer but as long as the poor are emancipated, justice is seen to be done.

Poverty in absolute numbers will dwindle and the Indian example of doing so through subsidies or the Chinese instance of increasing minimum wages are guiding in this light. The fallout of such a phenomenon may be that the ceiling gets much higher and the rich get relatively poorer but that may be a worthy trade-off. But the question that begs asking is whether movement of the floor must always lead to movement of the ceiling?

The revisiting of women's rights in the last few years and reconceptualisation of what it means to be a woman are facets of this shift of substructures. The modern woman is no longer an adjunct of another. She is not seen as a man's wife, a child's mother or someone's daughter. To continually push the limits of what it means to be good, when we raise the floor, we must do so in a manner that it is flexible, to accomodate interests of individuals of all circumstances.
